## **Restitution Request Guide**

The following is a guide to assist you in completing your restitution request. Some of these expenses may not apply to your situation. These examples are not a comprehensive list, only a guide. Please be aware that the decision to assess restitution is up to the Judge at the time of sentencing.

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Examples of expenses that <u>may</u> be recovered through restitution	Examples of expenses NOT recovered through restitution
incurred and reasonably expected to be incurred	<ul> <li>Payment for psychological pain, distress or suffering</li> <li>Any non-economic damages</li> <li>Lost wages for a family member of a victim [unless the victim is a minor, pursuant to the Crime Victim's Rights Act, MCL 780.752, Sec. 2 (j) (iii) ]</li> </ul>

\* IMPORTANT \* Examples of documentation that should be included when you return this form are: medical/dental bills, physical and occupational therapy bills, bills for ambulance service, medication receipts, receipts of insurance payments, letters from employer to document lost wages, estimates for stolen or damaged property, or counseling bills.
