ORDINANCE #17-04 County of St. Clair Ordinance No Wake Zone Krispin Blueway

An Ordinance establishing a no wake zone for a portion of the Krispin Drain a/k/a Krispin Blueway which is under the jurisdiction of the St. Clair County Drain Commissioner and which is located in the County of St. Clair. Be it ordained by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of St. Clair, Michigan:

Section 1.

Purpose:

The purpose of this Ordinance is to protect the shoreline along a

portion of the Krispin Blueway.

Section 2.

No Wake

Zone:

The Krispin Blueway extending from the North Channel of the St. Clair River to Krispin Road is hereby established as a

no wake zone and shall be posted as such. Any motorized water craft being operated in this no wake zone of the Krispin Blueway

shall be operated at idle speed while in the no wake zone.

Section 3.

Penalty: Any person who violates this ordinance shall be responsible for a civil infraction and a fine of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars for the first offense and Two Hundred Fifty (\$250.00) Dollars for repeat offenses by the same operator. This ordinance may be enforced by any enforcement office of the St. Clair County Sheriff's Department or any enforcement officer of Clay

Township.

Section 4.

<u>Severability</u>: The phrases, sentences, sections and provisions of this Ordinance are severable; if any portion of this Ordinance is found to be unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable; the remaining sections of the Ordinance shall remain in full force

and effect.

Section 6.

Repeal: All other Ordinances, parts of Ordinances or amendments to such Ordinances which conflict with this

Ordinance are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

This Ordinance was adopted by the St. Clair County Board of Commissioners on April 20, 2017 and shall be effective when published in a newspaper of general circulation in the County. The effective date of this Ordinance is May 1, 2017.
